Dear Parents and Community,

As you may be aware, NAPLAN results have arrived and been distributed. On a quick look at the statistical and cohort performance, we have once again areas of strength and significant growth along with areas of development. A quick snapshot:

Year 5 - All measures against State/National performance declared invalid due to size of Year 5 cohort <20. However, considering the controversy regarding the difficulty of the Writing task noted in recent press articles, the growth and performance of our Year 5 students appears to be in the top 1% of the nation's results.

Due to the lack of cohort validity we will be focusing on individual student responses to the tests and the notes taken by the supervising teachers regarding individual's attention to the tests and levels of illness and anxiety.

Year 3 - Cohort >20. Performance in all areas surpassed state and regional targets, remembering we are the highest performing region in the nation. Again, there are individual instances where targeted areas of need have been identified and will be planned for remediation.

The new planning cycle is upon us. This cycle will see a number of significant changes to the corporate governance of every NSW DEC school. The new plan pleasingly reduces markedly the reliance on NAPLAN as a measure of a schools and student performance. The plan will now see the school actively planning for and assessing Social and Emotional Learning (SEL). In conjunction with this change, is a new focus on the school community being an active and functional part of the planning process. As you will see from the school draft plan directions (provided at P&C meeting and available from the office) the community and the needs are embedded into the three school components and a standalone sector of the three sectors of the plan.

I have spoken at length to Neil Gow our P&C president regarding the plan and how the community will be contacted regarding community needs and directions for the school and students. Term Four will see a variety of surveys rolled out to community and new 2015 parents.

Congratulations to Miss Weeks who has been appointed as our substantive Assistant Principal. With all the changes and professional courses the principal is managing at the moment, the role of Assistant Principals throughout the State is changing markedly. The Assistant Principal now manages many of the previous roles once defined for the Principal. I am sure Miss Weeks' tenure at our school will be a rewarding and beneficial one for our students and community.

I would like to take this opportunity to remind everyone to be vigilant when our students are out and about , particularly walking to and from school. Remind them about stranger danger . No matter how 'nice' the person appears do not stop and talk to or accept anything from a stranger.

Lastly, I would like to thank everyone for a successful and productive Term 3. It's the exceptional work from students, staff and the community that make MKPS such a unique and dynamic learning place. Enjoy the well deserved break, spending time with loved ones and relaxing.
