PARLIAMENT VISIT FOR OUR 2018 SCHOOL LEADERS





Kindergarten Sugar Gliders explored numbers outdoors using hopscotch, sticks, stones and gumnuts.



Year 1 Wallabies took Maths and Literacy outside. They worked in pairs to make words using magnetic letters and scrabble tiles. Year One had fun collecting items from the playground and then classifying them into groups on a table. To clarify their understanding of time, they made an outdoor clock using numbers, a stick and some ribbon. Year One love being outdoors!



1/2 Emus read a chapter of the book *Fantastic Mr Fox* outside and mapped out the world as they visualise it using mostly natural elements.



2/3 Wombats enjoyed the sunshine (and the shade) to do DEAR (Drop Everything And Read) and as part of their Geography unit, students made journey sticks to recount their journey around the school grounds. Aboriginal people in Australia used journey sticks to more easily recount their journeys to other people upon their return. They found a large walking stick, collected materials found along the way, and tied them to the stick in chronological order.



3/4 Dingoes took their Maths learning outside, collecting items for a data lesson and having way too much on a Maths scavenger hunt.



4/5 Black Cockatoos took their Maths lesson outside where the children did a series of physical activities and then timed how long it took to complete. Students then took the fastest and slowest times and worked out the time elapsed between the two times.



5/6 Powerful Owls took their Music lesson outdoors where they created "Soundscapes" using nature. They wrote their own musical notation and used instruments from the environment to create their piece of music.

Last Tuesday we had our Jump off day to celebrate the completion of our Jump Rope For Heart fundraiser. MOUNT KURING-GAI PUBLIC SCHOOL BAND TRY AN INSTRUMENT SESSION

Dear Parents/Caregivers,

The Training Band is currently looking for new members for next year.

On **Thursday 22 November at 9:30am**, there will be a 'try an instrument' session in the hall for all Year 2 students. Students in Years 3 to 5 will also have the opportunity to attend if they are interested.

They will have the opportunity to try a range of instruments, under the supervision of professional musicians. Information will be available on where to hire or buy instruments and the contact details for music tutors.

Why play a musical instrument?

Music affects the brain in many positive ways. It makes you smarter, happier and more productive. Listening is good, playing is even better.

Playing music in a band not only encourages teamwork, but is scientifically proven to help brain function. Children with musical training are shown to do better in subjects like language, reading and maths. They also have better fine motor skills than their non-musical classmates. In addition to all these benefits, playing in a band is great fun!

The Band Program at Mount Kuring-gai

- Our **Training Band** rehearses on a Thursday morning from 8.25am until 9.05am. Each student is required to hire or buy their own instrument.
- Band fees are \$100 per term. In addition to band rehearsals, students are required to have an instrumental lesson each week. Private lessons typically cost \$30 \$35.
- Training band members progress to our **Performance Band** as their skills develop.
- All band members are given opportunities to perform throughout the year. Events include the Berowra Music Festival, Celebration of Learning, Kindy Kickstart presentation, as well as various school assemblies.

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K-2 HOME READING TIPS



- Home reading should be a positive experience for both parent and child. The book they take home will be a familiar book and it is okay (in fact it is beneficial) for the book to be read more than once or twice.
- Make it part of your routine and find the right time for you and your child to enjoy this special time together (mornings may work better than evenings in some cases).
- Let the reader hold the book and turn the pages.

Before reading:

Ask some questions about the book : What do you think the books is about? Why?

What do you notice about the picture on the front? Or if they have read it before : Do you remember what happened in the story? What do you like about the book? Is it a story or a fact book?

During reading:

- Listen to your child read the story.
- Let him/her hold the book and turn the pages.

If they read correctly, praise them as they turn each page. Try and be specific with your praise.

Eg. Great job! You corrected that all by yourself. Good job! That didn't make sense and you corrected it.

You are trying to re-read the sentence. Terrific! Your reading sounds just like talking. Fantastic!

Well done! You are reading with expression for the talking parts.

If your child makes an error or stops at a word give him/her 5 seconds to self-correct. If they don't self-correct, give them 5 seconds to have a go before telling them the word.

After reading:

Praise, Praise! The aim is for students to view themselves as successful readers.

Ask questions: What was your favorite part? What was the problem in the story? Which character did you like the best?

Important Note: Students who are reading beyond Level 17/18 are encouraged to read familiar books from school and also books from the school/local /home library, choosing books that they enjoy and are interested in.

If your child is becoming frustrated during the Home Reading process, please see your child's classroom teacher.
